Waste Management's approximately 300 disposal facilities employ the latest advances in landfill technology. From carefully selecting new landfill locations to installing state-of-the-art liners to expertly capping landfills that have been filled to capacity, Waste Management makes every effort to ensure its sites' operational integrity as well as the safety of surrounding ecosystems. ## Newton County Landfill

Serving greater southeast Texas and southwest Louisiana, Newton County Landfill provides local businesses and industries with professional disposal services that are safe, convenient and meet the highest standards for environmental compliance.

## Containment Design

Newton County Landfill utilizes composite compacted clay with an HDPE (High Density Polyethylene) liner.

## Leachate Collection & Treatment

At Newton County Landfill, leachate is maintained at or below 12 inches above the liner. Leachate is generally re-circulated into the landfill or, on occasion, may be disposed of at a permitted offsite facility.

## Groundwater Monitoring

Groundwater quality is tracked via nine monitoring wells that are sampled semi-annually.

## Gas Management

At Newton County Landfill, landfill gas is monitored regularly. At present, not enough gas is generated to warrant a flare or co-generation plant.

## Security

Security at Newton County Landfill is provided by a gatehouse and perimeter fencing.

- Yard Waste

Newton County Landfill does not accept the following wastes:

- 761 regulated PCB
- Hazardous Waste
- Radioactive Waste
- Untreated Red Bag Medical Waste

### Additional Site Information

**Industrial Waste Disposal** - Waste Management provides the highest level of industrial and special waste services backed with a written indemnification that protects customers from fines, lawsuits, sanctions or other legal/regulatory actions.

**Recycling** - Roadbase type materials are used to construct on-site roads.

**Waste Receipt Standard** - Waste Management has a defined waste screening protocol for each of its Subtitle D non-hazardous waste facilities. This waste screening procedure is used to protect both our employees and the environment. For all industrial and special waste streams, the generator or agent must complete a Generator's Non-Hazardous Waste Profile (available online at [www.WMDisposal.com](http://www.WMDisposal.com)) for review by our technical staff. Oftentimes, the profile must be accompanied by analyses, MSDS, or other pertinent information. Manifests or Waste Shipment Records must generally accompany the waste shipment.
