

El Sobrante Landfill

El Sobrante Landfill is a regional facility that provides safe and convenient disposal services for communities, businesses and industries in Southern California.

Waste Management's approximately 300 disposal facilities employ the latest advances in landfill technology. This facility is engineered with environmental protection systems that meet or exceed rigorous government regulations and are subject to highly regulated monitoring and reporting requirements. Systems include engineered liners and covers, leachate collection and removal, and landfill gas collection and control.

Containment Design

El Sobrante has been designed with a redundant composite liner system consisting of compacted clay, 40-mil high-density polyethylene (HDPE), geosynthetic clay liner and 60-mil high-density polyethylene (HDPE) surrounded by a layer of pea gravel and operational soil to aid with drainage. This containment design ensures that waste and wastewater (leachate) are contained and isolated from soil and groundwater.

Leachate Collection & Treatment

Leachate is recirculated back into this facility and used for dust control.

Groundwater Monitoring

Groundwater is currently monitored at 17 wells, which are both upgradient and downgradient of the waste disposal footprint. The groundwater is sampled and analyzed semi-annually in accordance with the procedures of the facility's groundwater sampling and analysis plan.

Security

Site security is ensured by controlled, limited access to the facility through the gatehouse as well as perimeter fencing and an onsite security guard during the evening and when the facility is closed.
